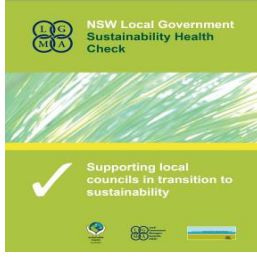
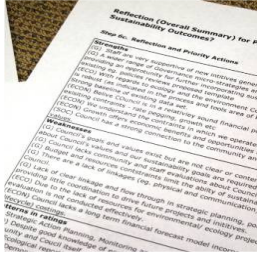




Sustainability Health Check Training

What is the NSW Local Government Sustainability Health Check? What does it do?

- A management assessment tool to identify which aspects of your organisational systems and processes support you in meeting strategic community, environment, economic, civic leadership and infrastructure goals and which parts need work.
- Users report gaining more collaboration within council, more support for sustainability matters, organisational commitment to strategic goals and the ability to diagnose and review council's performance with relation to sustainability matters. [Read case studies](#) here.



Why should I attend? What will my council get from the training?

The day is designed to help you use the NSW Local Government Sustainability Health Check (SHC) in your council. It includes a run through of the tool; shares different ways you can use it depending on your needs; success factors and how to integrate the findings with your council's strategic and operational planning and review cycles.

This training is targeted towards the needs of those working on organisational change for sustainability outcomes or responsible for delivering and reporting council strategic and /or sustainability plans. Max 2 per council.
